PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHT

The Airport and Airline Operations Liability Insurance Workshop is a comprehensive program designed to equip participants with the knowledge, tools, and methodologies necessary to effectively underwrite risks in the aviation sector.

The workshop begins with a full day of classroom learning focused on aviation hull underwriting. Participants will gain a foundational understanding of airline and aviation insurance, learning to identify and classify aircraft hulls. They will explore the mechanisms of underwriting, including the assessment criteria and rating processes, to build a strong foundation in this specialized field.

On the second day, the morning session features a study tour to an airport hangar and a drone operation site. This practical experience allows participants to immerse themselves in a real-world aviation environment. At the hangar, they will observe aircraft maintenance operations and explore the various risks associated with aviation. The visit to the drone operation site offers additional insights into emerging technologies in the industry, providing valuable context for underwriting decisions.

The afternoon session on the second day returns to the classroom with a focus on aviation liability underwriting. Participants will learn about the types of liability risks present within airport vicinities, including moral and physical hazards that impact aviation insurance. The session also covers key elements such as clauses, exclusions, and endorsements required to draft comprehensive insurance policies.

By blending theoretical knowledge with hands-on exposure, this workshop provides a dynamic and engaging learning experience tailored to professionals looking to enhance their skills in aviation insurance underwriting.

At the end of the programme, participants should be able to:

1. Identify and describe the risks and liabilities at the airport and airlines environment
2. Describe the underwriting practice and the formation of contract
3. Identify and explain the hazards that effects aviation insurance
4. Demonstrate the methods of rating aircraft hull, airport, drone and liability insurance
5. Describe airplanes, helicopters and UAV(Drones)
6. Draft aviation insurance policies by considering the policy wordings, exclusions, endorsements, and clauses.

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HRD Claim Application

Asian Institute of Insurance (Aii) courses have been granted the status of Approved Training Programme (ATP) under the Human Resources Development Act 1992. Based on Training Providers Circular No. 3/2021, PSMB has imposed a requirement that training providers need to register their training programme under the HRD Corp Claimable Course Scheme to offer training to the employers who are registered under the Human Resource Development Corporation (HRD Corp).

1. What is HRD Corp Claimable Courses?

HRD Corp Claimable Courses formerly known as SBL Khas is a scheme to assist registered employers, especially those with limited resources to train and upskill their employees in line with their operational and business requirements. Under this scheme, HRD Corp will pay the course fee (subjected to 4% service fee from 1st April 2021) directly to the training providers by deducting the amount from the employers' levy account. HRD Corp will also pay other claimable allowances to the employer.

2. How are Training Providers or Employers to submit for HRD Corp Claimable Courses?

Asian Institute of Insurance (Aii) will submit their Courses registration via the HRDC e-Tris system. Once course is approved as Claimable Course (previously known as SBL Khas course), the approved course will appear in the HRDC e-Tris system.

Employers will need to access the e-Tris system to select the course and submit to HRDC for grant approval. The total claimable amount is subject to the approval of each Employer individual grant application, Once HRDC approves Employer grant, the company must provide the approved grant code to Asian Institute of Insurance (Aii).

After the training is conducted, Employers are required to complete HRDC Attendance Reports eg. JD14 and submit necessary documents to ensure HRDC settlement of Asian Institute of Insurance (Aii) invoice.

Asian Institute of Insurance (Aii) will submit the invoice directly to HRDC with the approved grant code for each participant or Employer.

- Effective **1st August 2019**, training programmes must commence within six (6) months from the date of training grant applications are made and training claim submissions must be made not more than six (6) months from the date the training programmes are completed.
- Application must be submitted by employers before training date commencement.
